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
Who is ALICE?

- Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed
- Above the Federal Poverty Level, but below the <u>Household Survival Budget</u>
- Low-wage jobs cashiers, retail workers, health care support positions, general production/laborers, office support positions, child care workers, bank tellers
- Limited to no savings for emergencies or investing in the future











ALICE Households by Income: State





ALICE Households by Income: Wood


Households by Income, Wood County, 2010 to 2018

Households by Income, Adams County, 2010 to 2018





Household Income by Household Type, Wood County, 2018





Household Income by Household Type, Adams County, 2018




Households by Age, Wood County, Wisconsin, 2018

Households by Age, Adams County, Wisconsin, 2018






ALICE Families with Children

Children add significant expense to a family budget, so it is not surprising that many families with children live below the ALICE Threshold. Though more families are headed by married parents, families with a single parent are more likely to have income below the ALICE Threshold.


Families With Children, Wood County, Wisconsin, 2018



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
Families With Children, Adams County, Wisconsin, 2018






Race & Ethnicity of ALICE


Trend: Cost of Living Is Increasing

The cost of household essentials (housing, child care, food, transportation, health care, a smart phone plan and taxes) are rising faster than the cost of other goods and services.

Consumer Price Index is increasing by 1.8% annually.

Basic household items ALICE families buy is increasing by 3.4% annually.






Maintainers

Trend: Worker Vulnerability

- Though unemployment was low in 2018, it masked three trends:
 - Growth in the number of low-wage jobs
 - Minimal increases in wages
 - More fluctuations in job hours, schedules and benefits
- The "Side" Hustle
- Jobs paying less than \$20 per hour are more likely to be replaced by technology. North Central Wisconsin has a high risk of automation due to the high percentage of employment in administrative support, production, food preparation, sales and material moving.


