GOAL: YOUTH HAVE ACCESS TO MENTORS, ROLE MODELS AND ENRICHMENTS OUTSIDE OF THE SCHOOL DAY IN A SAFE ENVIRONMENT WHICH ENHANCES PERSONAL GROWTH, CHARACTER DEVELOPMENT, & ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT.

35% of Wood County and 44% of Adams County households are struggling - despite most of these households earning income above the Federal Poverty Level. Working, yet unable to afford all essentials or save for emergencies, we term these households ALICE: Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed.



For many ALICE families, low wages and non-traditional work schedules mean before and after school care is necessary, yet unaffordable.

United Way's investment in partner programs helps ALICE families bridge the gap meaning families with financial need can access safe, trustworthy wrap around care.

ALICE families don't have the means to enroll in many youth programs, leaving children behind their peers and without valuable life skills.

United Way's investment in partner programs provides sponsorships to ALICE families - meaning youth have access to mentorships and skill-building programs.
